Town Criers and TARS on the Street



On March 30, 2019, the Town Criers and the Photos by TCCR Staff Teen Age Republicans (TARS) engaged the public in the historic district of St. Augustine, Florida.

The Town Criers of the Saint Augustine Tea Party (SATP) took a field trip down St George Street with a two-fold purpose.

The first goal was to test the response from the crowd while wearing red MAGA hats. Most news outlets discourage the wearing of MAGA hats by suggesting that you will be singled out for harassment and embarrassment. This is even true of the new voice for progressive Republicans, Fox News. SATP members who have worn the MAGA hats have had a different experience. In the early Tea Party days, when one wore a Tea Party T-shirt, people would look at the T-shirt and say, "I like that T-shirt". But, they would also question whether it was dangerous to wear one. Voter Fraud at St. Augustine High School



On April 9, 2019 a debate between The Young

Republicans and The Young Democrats occurred in the auditorium of the St. Augustine High School. A faculty member, Megan Young, served as the moderator.

There had been national media exposure of conservative students being bullied, intimidated and harassed by fellow students and faculty at St. Augustine High School. Recently students from the High School attended the St. Augustine Tea Party meeting and presented their grievances. The students were seeking support.

To view the situation from a different perspective, the St. Augustine Tea Party (SATP) decided to attend the debate. According to the moderator there were more in attendance that had been expected. Tea Party members report that there was a group of students seated on one side of the auditorium and a group of adults of about equal number across the middle and the other side. How many of the students were conservative is unknown. However the adults present tended to be predominantly supportive of the Young Republicans. Some wore MAGA hats which attracted the attention of the young students.

There were two resolutions debated; both favorites of the Democratic Progressives. The first was on global warming and the second was on gun control. The resolutions were phrased so as to put the conservatives on the defensive according to Anne Marie Gennusa. Gennusa is a local attorney who is a Republican candidate for the Office of Public Defender. Gennusa also disclosed that she could not register vote and was aware that large numbers of Republicans also were unable to login to cast votes after the resolutions were debated.

Prior to the debate of a resolution, a poll was taken to show support for the resolution. The polls demonstrated substantial undecided votes. After the debate the poll was taken again this time the poll was overwhelmingly supportive of the Young Democrats. Those in the audience could vote using Facebook Messenger. Lance Thate, SATP Chairman reported that he could not log on to vote and after the debates were completed conducted a survey as to voting irregularities. He reports that he could find no adults supporting the Young Republicans who were actually able to cast a vote. The moderator apologized suggesting that she did not expect so many in attendance which caused the irregularity. The Tea Party Chairman was heard to say, "Be that as it may in my world we call it the voter fraud."

government's plan to refinance mortgages and called for a new Tea Party event such as occurred in Boston in 1773. A new Tea Party, if you will. The broadcast occurred on February 19, 2009.

By tax day, April 15, 2009, the birth of the populist Tea Party movement had gathered strength. There were rallies across the country. The Christian Science Monitor, at the time, reported rallies in 750 cities with an estimated half a million people attending.

By September 2009 over 2 million people appeared in DC to oppose Obama care and resist Obama's transformation of America. During this expansive period, the media understated, distorted and produced disinformation. Fake news has been around for a very long time. The establishment of both parties has never been about "We the People". They have been about themselves. The establishment is just opposite sides of the same coin.

During the 2012 election campaign, GOP State Committeeman and Committeewomen in Florida met in Tallahassee to deal with the subject of "Control or Destroy Tea Party" groups. Republicans did not like Tea Party candidates. They tended to come from outside the party structure. They also were inclined to be less controllable. The neoconservatives of the Republican Party have been relatively successful. Today there are only a handful of Tea

While the Republican leadership was successful in taking the Tea Party out of the conversation on mainstream media, including Fox News, they have not been successful in removing the memory of the Tea Party from the people.

This past weekend the St. Augustine Tea Party (SATP) positioned its 38 foot replica of the Dartmouth, one of three ships from which tea was thrown into Boston harbor in 1773, at the Castillo de San Marcos, in the historic district of St. Augustine Florida. The docking was to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Tea Party movement. The spark ignited by Santelli on February 19, 2009 broke into a roaring flame on April 15, 2009 the official birth date of the movement. The Tea Party estimates that they were seen by 15 to 20,000 people over their two-day stay and in the process engaged at least 1000 people. David Heimbold SATP Treasurer reports that donations were as favorable as they have ever been. "You know the people love you when they pop a \$20 bill in the donation jar just because you are there," Heimbold said.

According to SATP Chairman, Lance Thate:

"The public displayed high levels of frustration with both political parties but enjoyed supporting the President and was pleased about the Tea Party's continued existence and its celebration of its birthday. The Tea Party reports that for practical purposes there was no push back at all in spite of the fact that MAGA hats were plentiful. We will let the pictures of the public with the President speak for themselves.

It's Ground-Hog-Day, Again!

It was Ground-Hog-Day again, with a shadow being cast at the St Augustine Commissioners meeting on Monday, April 22, 2019. This was caused by the St Augustine Record's article of April 9th, by Sheldon Gardner entitled, "St. Augustine Commissioner Changes course on Confederate Memorial."

"In October of 2017, Nancy Sikes-Kline, along with the rest of the Commissioners, voted in favor of keeping the Monument and adding historical context to the site via plaques", according to this article.

The Commissioners then proceeded to appoint City Manager, John Regan, the responsibility of selecting the contextualization contributors. Regan promptly appointed J. Michael Butler, a Flagler College history professor to write the racist White Supremacy clause for the defacement of the Monument. Butler is pictured below displaying the Communist salute. It should be remembered that the City Manager boasted that he could have the monument down in eight hours, at night, without public interference.

The front page article of the Record set off alarm bells as Patriots and locals came out in force to protect the Confederate Memorial to the dead soldiers who never made it home. The Patriots have been double-crossed by the City Manager before.

Jill Pacetti, a local activist and Tea Party member, whipped up over 11,000 write-ins to 'Keep the Monument' that flipped the Commissioners back in 2017 and rallied the troops for battle.

Jill and her defenders of the Memorial arrived at the Commissioners April 22nd meeting with yellow T-Shirts that read: "Our Veterans, Our Memorial, Our Family. Their Lives Mattered"

There were a host of other Defenders of the Memorial who spoke in favor of keeping the Memorial as is. Hugh Washington, a veteran, was passionate about defending the sacred site on the Plaza. Hugh listed Veteran's burial sites around the world that hold respect for fallen veterans.

Dave Heimbold, also a Tea Party activist, raised the ire of Mayor Upchurch when he raised his fist in the Universal Communist salute simply to demonstrate how Ron Rawls intimidated tourists on St George Street, in front of the "Bunnery", at the "Nights of Lights" celebration, at a concert on the 4th of July and at the Castillo de San Marcos on that same Independence Day. The raised fist Communist salute is given by Rawls at every

public demonstration as he encourages violence. Yet, the Chief of Police, his boss, John Regan and the City Commissioners ignore the lawbreakers. This is a mob which travels here from out of town and City officials do nothing to stop them when they break ordinances, threaten civil disruption, yell violently and the like. On the "Nights of Lights" the police actually cleared the sidewalks for the demonstrators, thus forcing the public off their right of way. This is a clear violation for anyone other than the "Black Racist". Police Chief Fox was present and observed the occurrence.

Heimbold continued to rebuke the City commissioners and Chief Fox for not enforcing the law. "Apparently Ron Rawls has black privilege that permits him to scream 'White Privilege' and 'Take them Down' as he interrupts local businesses and interrupts their City Commissioner's meetings," Heimbold said. Mayor Upchurch reprimanded Heimbold and told him not to make personal attacks against the perpetrator of black racism. The new Mayor apparently did not recognize that Heimbold was not name-calling, but was simply making a definitive statement relating to Rawls. Proofs of the assertions are abundant if one takes the time to investigate. Mayor Upchurch recently replaced Nancy

Shaver as Mayor. She chose to resign for health reasons. Mayor Shaver addressed the St. Augustine Tea Party (SATP) several times and occasionally attended Tea Party meetings. "The Tea Party members rarely agreed with Mayor Shaver's views, however, she was always treated with respect. After Mayor Upchurch was appointed Mayor, the SATP reached out to have the new Mayor address the group. Mayor Upchurch never responded," Lance Thate, SATP Chairman revealed.

After the public comments on the agenda concluded, the patriot crowd strolled down to the Memorial in question for a photo op.

Yes... it's Ground-Hog-Day, yet again, in St. Augustine, Florida. This dance has been going on for a couple years. The City Commissioners have sided with the race baiting minority while at the same time they try to placate the more than 85% of the locals who want the Monuments left

alone.

The public needs to see a lot more 'Sunshine' and a stop to the backroom dealings. Over 85% of the public want to keep the sacred Memorials as they are. Yet, Commissioner Nancy Sikes-Kline and the City Manager Regan meet at the Grace United Methodist Church with, none other than, Ron Rawls and the 'Take Them Down' bunch. Not hard to see where their loyalty lies.
